

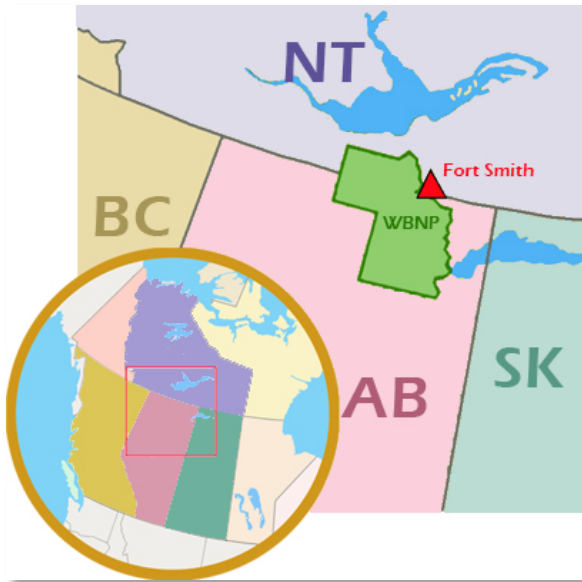

Driving

Fort Smith has highway access via northern Alberta and from Edmonton there are two options;

#1: To Fort Smith via Slave Lake / Red Earth

Edmonton to Slave Lake: AB Hwy #44 / #2 (north)
 Slave Lake to High Level: AB Hwy #88 (north) / #58 (west)
 High Level to Enterprise: AB Hwy #35 (north) / NT Hwy #1
 Enterprise to Fort Smith: NT Hwy #2 (north) / #5 (east)

#2: To Fort Smith via Valleyview / Peace River

Edmonton to Valleyview: AB Hwy #16 (west) / #43 (north)
 Valley View to High Level: AB Hwy #49, #2 / #35 (north)
 High Level to Enterprise: AB Hwy #35 (north) / NT Hwy #1
 Enterprise to Fort Smith: NT Hwy #2 (north) / #5 (east)

Flying

Fort Smith is serviced by daily scheduled flights from Edmonton and Yellowknife (*except Saturdays*). The carrier, Northwestern Air Lease offers discount airfares for registered festival participants.
